

Nearly 70% of teachers have at least one grieving student in their classroom







## Impact of Grief



- Suffer in silence (41% don't want to upset surviving parent, trouble finding people to understand and relate)
- Greater risk of depression, suicide and substance abuse
- Difficulty concentrating (observed by 87% of teachers)
- Absenteeism (observed by 72% of teachers)
- Difficulty concentrating in the classroom (observed by 87% of teachers)
- Research: with consistent supports 6 years to move forward








# Childhood Bereavement: The Cost of Inaction

## GTG Impact on SEL



#### Social Relationships

- 88% impact on family relationships
- 91% impact with school staff relationships
- 94% impact with classmate relationships

#### **Emotions**

- 91% impact on feeling of sadness
- 91% impact on feelings related to hopelessness
- 82% impact on feelings of guilt
- 93% impact on feelings of loneliness

#### Learning

- 97% impact on knowledge of grief
- 99% impact on knowledge of coping skills
- 79% impact on grades
- 76% impact on attendance
- 87% impact on ability to concentrate in the classroom

## 2019-20 Minnetonka Highlights



- Fully engaged students
  - 63 students throughout the year
  - 61 in 12 peer support groups
  - intermittent individual sessions throughout the year
  - 844 total student contacts throughout the year (86% group and 14% individual)
- Utilization of all three modalities by staff














## 2019-20 - Minnetonka relationship of the family member or friend that died








# 2019 - 20 Minnetonka Student Reported Cause of Death








## 2019-20 Minnetonka Ethnicity

# Brianna's Story – Resilient, Confident and Unstoppable



- Briana is a 2019-20 graduating senior. She is also a seven year participant of GTG. Briana's father died when she was nine years old, in third grade, and living in California. His name is Thomas and he died of pancreatic cancer.
- At such a young age Briana did not know how to respond to the death of her father and was confused like so many other young children her age. She didn't know how this thing called "grieving" was supposed to happen and she began to search for anyone that could related to what she was experiencing.
- Briana was referred to GTG by the school support staff. This is where she
  met her best friend and they began to explore the concept of grieving
  together. She realized that although everyone grieves, it doesn't look the
  same for each person. Her grief counselor helped her reflect on the value of
  sharing her grief story, hearing other student stories and exploring a variety
  of coping skills and activities that help externalize feelings she had pent up
  for so long.
- Prior to GTG, Brianna was struggling with understanding and managing her grief. She was in denial and often blamed herself for the death of her dad. With the help of GTG she was able to find a healthier way to approach life. She states, "I would not have been able to come to the solutions I did without the support of GTG." and "I acknowledged that I was going to be okay and I can do life while grieving"
- As Briana prepares for college, she was asked what three words would describe her after seven years of GTG support and completing her foundational education. She paused, as if being limited to three words would be a challenge. She then shared the words that demonstrated her readiness to take on this next stage of life ... resilient, confident and unstoppable!

# Carol – GTG mother finding support after the death of her husband



I am a mother of seven. 11 years ago my husband unexpectedly died when he was out of town. At that time, my children were 11, 12, 16, 17, 18, 22 and 23. My 3 teenagers were attending Hopkins High School.

In the weeks following his death, the Program Director of GTG reached out to me at home to inform me of the program in the schools. She was personable with me and the children. Their participation in small group meetings helped them navigate their next several years.

11 years later, I truly believe this program helped them become well balanced and thriving adults.


